# **Financial Reports**

## Joseph Fund

The Joseph Fund is used at Crossroads to accumulate funds for major building-andgrounds-related expenditures. The name – Joseph Fund – comes from the story of Joseph in Genesis 41:29-41. Based on a vision from God, Joseph gathered resources for use as needs arose in the future. Contributions to the Joseph Fund come from members of Crossroads and have included transfers from the Operating Fund or Foundation. Expenditures have occurred periodically based on the life spans of items needing major repair or replacement. Examples include roofing, heating and air-conditioning equipment, and the parking lot.



The Joseph Fund had a cash balance of \$166,299 on July 1, 2023. During the 2023-24 fiscal year, the Joseph Fund received \$14,698 in contributions from members, \$655 in interest

income, and a \$78,086 transfer from the Foundation. Expenditures included \$169,907 for repairs to the parking lot, \$53,877 for boiler replacements, and \$20,937 for HVAC compressors. We ended the year with a cash balance of \$14,988 on June 30, 2024.

Effective July 1, 2024, we will adopt a best practice in church accounting and record capital expenditures, as well as Foundation grants tied to capital projects, in the Operating Fund. Members may continue to donate to the Joseph Fund. The Joseph Fund will be the repository/restricted account for capital funds and will make grants to the Operating Fund for capital projects. Please consider donating to the Joseph Fund.

## **Memory Garden**

The Memory Garden, located in the upper level of the church grounds just outside the Fireside Room, was constructed in 2008 and dedicated on November 2nd of that year. The columbarium has 220 niches, each able to hold two urns, and we now have 130 niches that have been purchased. The Memory Garden is available to Crossroads members and their immediate families, and we now have 82 inurned.

In this past fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, there were 5 niches purchased for a total of \$12,500. Total expenses, including maintenance, landscaping, snow removal, engraving, and investment fees totaled \$4,718.

Investments are administered by the Memory Garden Governing Committee and invested by the Crossroads Foundation Committee.

An In Memoriam Service was held at the Memory Garden on Sunday, July 7, 2024, with friends and family of those inurned in the columbarium.

The fee for a niche is \$2,500, which includes two urns as well as the engraving. There are no other expenses. Having a niche can be a big part of end-of-life planning and can be especially comforting for the next generation.

# Looking Ahead at Crossroads (cont.)

#### Looking ahead to the 2024-25 fiscal year budget:

- Offerings Increase: The 2024-25 offerings budget has a 1.4% increase over 2023-24 actual offerings. This was a conservative estimate as offerings this past year offerings increased by 2.8%
- Expense Reduction: Expenses are budgeted to decrease \$58,038 (3.3%) compared to 2023-24 actual expenses. This decrease is due to lower capital expenditures, and an Administrative Staff restructuring conducted by the Human Resources team given retirements and transitions, and the elimination of some other smaller positions like Children's Ministry Interns. These efforts will save over \$46,761, although some of these savings are offset by increases in other areas.
- **Staff Support**: Staff received a 2% cost of living increase.
- **Projected Deficit**: We are anticipating a deficit of \$94,383 for the 2024-25 fiscal year, partly because we budgeted for a flat roof replacement project as part of our capital needs inventory. However, this is an improvement of \$67,278 over the deficit of \$161,661 in 2023-24 when restated to include capital expenditures.
- **Closing the Gap:** Your generous giving and pledges for 2025 might very well close this deficit, as it did this past fiscal year.
- **Foundation Allocation:** This new 2024-2025 fiscal year the \$74,793 Foundation Allocation (4% of a rolling 12-quarter average) has been allocated to the Joseph Fund. This will cover the cost of the flat roof capital project as well as some other capital needs projects.
- **Positive Development:** After budgeting, we received roofing bids that came in significantly lower than projected. This means deficit will likely be reduced from what is printed here.

For over 15 years, Crossroads approved budgets with anticipated deficit. The Session has been working diligently over the last two years to close this gap. This past year the Session and Human Resources team worked hard on staff restructuring to ensure our ministry can continue to flourish.

Crossroads members generosity has been instrumental, and it has multiplied into lives changed for Christ. We humbly invite the congregation to continue to stepping forward in faith—to pledge and give—as we seek to live into our mission and close the deficit.

#### Notes

<sup>1.</sup> Capital expenditures have historically been expensed in the Joseph Fund. Beginning July 1, 2024, these expenditures will be recorded in the Operating Fund, along with transfers from the Joseph Fund, in order to provide a complete view of the use of church funds in the operating income statement. Beginning July 1, 2024, the Joseph Fund income statement will consist of donations, earnings, and transfers to the Operating Fund.

<sup>2.</sup> Capital expenditures include major outlays for the repair and replacement of the roof, parking lot, HVAC systems, sanctuary, CLC, and technology, windows and exterior, and carpet, blinds, and lighting.
